Public Notice Community Engagement Medicine Lodge Ski Hill Masterplan and Asset Utilization Study




The Town of Bentley and Central Alberta Economic Partnership in conjunction with Planvision Consulting Ltd and McElhanney is inviting you to an open house on June 7th at the Bentley Community Hall, 4821 - 50 Steet, from 7:00pm to 9:00pm. This open house is a follow up to the extensive engagement that took place throughout February and March of 2023 in relation to the Medicine Lodge Ski Hill Masterplan.

The meeting will provide an opportunity for the public to review the study findings and next steps prior to the report being finalized.

As many of you know the Medicine Lodge Ski Hill has been a part of the community for over 70 years and we would like to keep it that way. We have undertaken an initial analysis of existing infrastructure and have incorporated feedback into the plan regarding future opportunities for the hill. Special Needs Assistance for Seniors

If you are a senior who qualifies for assistance via the Seniors Special Needs Assistance Program, you may be eligible to be reimbursed for a variety of things. If you are not sure what this program is, please contact 403.748.2160. Copies of the program booklet can be printed for you, or you can view it on the internet here https://open.alberta.ca/publications/6756730.

HIGHLIGHT: The Special Needs Assistance Program has a reimbursement for light housekeeping and/or yard work with criteria for access. If you qualify for this program you can engage whomever you wish to clean as long as you have a receipt and they are not a family member. This is a secondary item under the program, income levels are below. Additionally, to qualify you must have a doctor's letter if you are under 80 <u>and</u> no one else living in the household can do the housekeeping. Over 80, there is no medical criteria.

Community Services often receives inquiries regarding light housekeeping services/yard assistance.

We cannot refer potential house cleaners, snow shovelers or yard help. Doing so, without vetting or staffing a position, leaves the Town potentially liable for that connection should an issue arise. We encourage you to reach out to community members to see whom is offering services.

What we can do is assist you to see if you qualify for any of the items you are interested in under the program and with your paperwork to submit to for reimbursement.



Reminder for Weekly Residential Garbage Collection - Don't be missed because your garbage is not available for pick up. Please have your garbage (maximum 4 bags, 40 lbs. or less) ready for pick up by 7:30 am on regular garbage days for collection. Please be patient if it isn't picked up at the same time each week. The public works personnel collecting garbage changes, as may the route and the volume of garbage.

Business Licenses - With a few exceptions, all Commercial and Home based businesses in the Town of Bentley require a valid yearly Business License. This also applies to those businesses and services that are not located in the town of Bentley but are coming into town to conduct business or provide a service. The application form can be found on the Town's website or picked up at the Town office.

Monthly Tax installment - Payments are an option with the Town of Bentley. For more information on this program, please call the town office or drop in and speak with one of our staff.

*We have continued with Lacombe County working on the Bentley Southeast Area Structure Plan. – There will be a Public Engagement scheduled for June 29, 2023

*Our council meetings have been busy times as well. We have met as the Municipal Planning Commission dealing with development requests, and several presentations.

*A survey was sent out for suggestions in the renaming of our Subdivision, that is now presenting great reasonable individual lots, ready to be purchased and have homes built on.

PUBLIC MEETING SOUTHEAST BENTLEY AREA STRUCTURE PLAN

The Town of Bentley and Lacombe County are working together to encourage commercial and industrial growth opportunities in the north half of Section 23-40-1-W5M, situated within Lacombe County, southeast of Bentley.

The objective of this project is to provide a conceptual framework and design standards through which future industrial and commercial development may occur on these subject lands. The proposed *Southeast Bentley Area Structure Plan* has been drafted in response to the feedback received from the public meeting held in




November 2022. The Plan Area has been reduced in size, removing the SW and SE 23 in response to concerns expressed by landowners. This proposed Plan also includes provisions that address concerns expressed about land use compatibility for the proposed commercial area south of 48 Avenue. The draft Plan can be viewed on either municipalities' websites.

On Thursday, June 29, 2023, we will be hosting a second public meeting about the project. You are welcome to attend to share your feedback on the proposed Plan! Your input will help us make key decisions for the next steps of the Project.

Display boards will be available for viewing and there will be an opportunity for discussions and questions after the presentation. A survey will be available to gather feedback at the meeting, and a survey link will be available afterwards on the websites.

The Bentley Fire Department has responded to nine emergency callouts since our last report. On April 24, Crews were called out to a large wildland fire west of town. The fire was in a tricky combination of grass and treed areas, with hilly terrain and difficult access adding to the challenges. Eckville Fire was called out to bring

their side-by-side to help access some spots. The fire took over seven hours to bring under control, to the point where responsibility could be turned back over to the landowner. In all, an area around six acres in size was burned.

Our next wildland fire occurred on April 27. This was a request for mutual aid from our neighbors to the east in Lacombe. Bentley's Rapid unit was put to work extinguishing a large area, while the water tender made several trips to provide water for firefighting operations. This was another long call, at over five hours.



Sparks from welding equipment started another grass fire south of town on April 28. The people who called in the fire were happy to see us arrive, as the fire had already crossed a highway when we got there. The fire was quickly extinguished using hand lines.

On May 1, crews were again called out, this time for a vehicle fire. Although the truck was a total loss, the fire had not spread to the surrounding vegetation.

A large tractor, still attached to a cultivator was fully engulfed in fire by the time Bentley units were able to get to the scene on May 6. Fortunately, the fire had again not spread to the surrounding area and the cultivator was undamaged. The cause of the fire is still under investigation.

A rather mysterious fire at the Aspen Beach Campground brought firefighters out on the night of May 6. A long, narrow area of brush had burned near the entrance to the campground, and a small area was still actively burning. No natural cause for the fire could be explained, so it would seem that this fire may have been intentionally set. It is extremely fortunate that the wind was blowing in the direction it was, or things could have ended badly.

On May 17, the Fire Department was toned out for a small gasoline leak. Crews were able to clean up the spill quickly.

Finally, on May 13 and again on May 18, firefighters were called to investigate reports of illegal campfires at Brewers Campground. In both cases, the fires were just propane fire pits, which are legal to use even during a fire ban.

Bentley's Rapid, which is also what is known as a Type Six Engine, was called into service to help fight the Eagle Fire near Fox Creek on May 11. One member from the Bentley Fire Department and three members from Lacombe were deployed for eight days and worked as part of a Task force holding the fire at bay and providing structural protection for Fox Creek and



Little Smoky. On May 18, this crew was relived by a second crew with members from Lacombe and Clive taking over. While the recent rains have been a blessing, the fire season has only just begun. Please be careful when disposing of cigarettes and obey all guidelines when camping.
