


## Blindman Valley Agricultural Centre, 5202 53 Street Close, Bentley

(located behind the Bentley Arena off of 50<sup>th</sup> Street)

The proposed annexation area incorporates lands in the north half of Section 23, Township 40, Range 1, West of the 5<sup>th</sup> Meridian, located to the south and east of Bentley (shown as the shaded area on the map below). The proposed annexation area was the subject of the Southeast Bentley Area Structure Plan that was approved by Lacombe County Council in November 2023.

The purpose of the meeting is to present information about the annexation proposal and the process undertaken to date and to provide the public with an opportunity to comment on the proposed annexation. A brief presentation will be provided at the start of the meeting followed by a question / answer and discussion session.



I would like to begin this report with some great news: We have had a very good response to our recruitment campaign, with seven new potential recruits showing interest in joining the department. It is great to see that there are so many folks willing to step up for their community. If you are still thinking about it, don't wait too long! We will need to start the selection and intake process right away so that we can bring on our most qualified candidates.

The start of the year, aside from the Monkey Top fire, has been quite slow for your local volunteer firefighters. In fact, as of my writing this report (March 23), we have not had a single call in the month of March. With the predicted dry weather coming this spring, we are enjoying the calm while it lasts.

On January 23, the department responded to a medical assist call. Members assisted the EMS crew with the patient until they were released from the scene.

On January 28, we were called out to a large outside fire south of town. The fire turned out to be one that was both permitted and being well monitored. On January 29, we had a similar call at a different location. A burn permit was not required at the times of these fires, but this would be a good time to remind county residents that burn permits are now required for all burns (other than those for warming or cooking) from March 1 to October 31. As well, please know that only the following materials may be burned:

Brush and fallen trees

Used power and telephone poles that do not contain preservatives Wood or wood products not containing preservatives

Solid waste from tree harvesting

Straw, stubble, grass, weeds, leaves, and tree prunings

Solid waste from post and pole operations that does not contain wood preservatives

The list of what may NOT be burned is long, but can be found on the Lacombe County website.

On February 1, Bentley was toned out to assist Eckville Fire with a structure fire in a mobile home in their town. Crews assisted with extinguishing and overhauling the fire for a couple of hours. The

building was heavily damaged by the fire, but there were - thankfully - no injuries to the occupant, who managed to escape the building on their own.

On February 10, crews were again called out, this time to a Carbon Monoxide alarm. As it turned out, the issue was just a low battery in the CO detector. Remember, when you change your clocks in the spring and fall, that is a good time to change the batteries in your smoke and CO detectors.

You may have noticed a grain truck on its side in the roundabout on Highway 12 and 20 on February 16. Five members of the department went out to assist. Fortunately, the driver was not injured and crews only had to help secure the scene and control traffic.

On February 21, crews were called out to a truck fire. The vehicle was a total loss by the time we arrived on scene, and the RCMP left it up to the owners to tow the wreckage away.

Our last call was an unusual one. We were called out to a structure fire on Gull Lake. As in...on the actual lake itself at an ice-fishing shack rental operation. There is not an ice thickness that will make us comfortable bringing the Engine onto the lake, so we took our Rapid unit out to see what we could do. When we got to scene, we were unsure what was burning. With only 450 gallons of water in the tank, we had to make a couple of trips to refill before the fire was extinguished. As it turned out, it was a wood-fired sauna that had caught fire. The renters decided to head home for the night and sleep in their own beds.

Reminder for Weekly Residential Garbage Collection - Don't be missed because your garbage is



By the time you read this, removal of the Monkey Top with the Asbestos clean up should be completed. As of now there is no confirmed word about the process of replacing the Monkey Top Saloon. We have sold our first lot in our subdivision. As people start to build, we are sure other lots will be selling.

Our grocery store is quickly approaching a reopening. Let's be looking forward to a very positive 2024.

We have been looking at every possible way of saving our Arena. We have worked at many ways in approaching the federal government for a Canada Green and Inclusive Buildings Grant. After nineteen months of Our CAO, Marc, council, and Honorable Blaine Calkins in continual contact with the minister in charge. Marc did everything we needed to have a grant qualified and again and again asking for a promised, [online] meeting. After requesting over and over, while we watched other communities in Alberta receiving grants, it was frustrating to say the least. A few weeks ago, we received an email saying we didn't qualify. I had even contacted the Prime Minister and Deputy Prime Minister and Finance Minister to no response. We are determined to find a way to save our arena. I even asked for a CTV crew asking about the Monkey Top to do a newsworthy story about our journey to save our widely used central arena.

Moving forward to this Past Weekend Hundreds of volunteers, sponsors and community put on the U13 FEMALE TIER 1 PROVINCIAL CHAMPIONSHIPS in our arena in Bentley. March 21-24. A huge thanks to our Blindman Valley Minor Hockey Association and everyone who took on the Challenge. A special thanks to our arena manage Graham Parsons and Jack for working overtime to keep our plant from shutting down to get us through.

I was able to be there for the CHAMPIONSHIP final at 4pm. Sunday to witness the exciting game between the Airdrie Lightning and, OUR, West Central Wildcats. WE WON IN THE SECOND OVERTIME!

The thank you's from so many visitors to myself as Mayor on behalf of our town and area for opening the doors and welcoming hundreds of people to our community and facilities was overwhelming. YAHOO! And Thanks to all.


