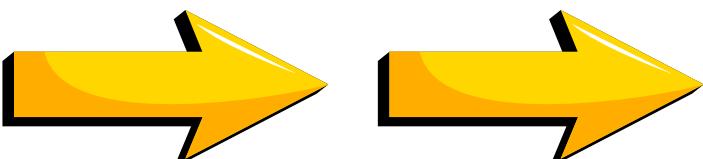

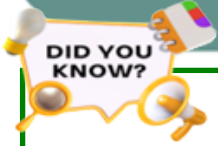

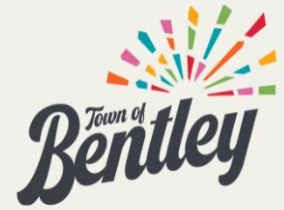

The Bentley Museum Society, in partnership with the Rimbey Legion and the Town of Bentley, is proud to announce plans to bring a meaningful and highly visible Veteran Banner Project to our community this year.

This initiative is designed to honor and recognize past and present members of the Canadian Armed Forces and Allied Forces by displaying commemorative banners throughout the community. These banners serve as a powerful tribute—celebrating the courage, service, and sacrifice of those who have contributed to our freedom. Inspired by the successful project in Rimbey, where banners line the streets in recognition of local veterans, Bentley residents will soon have the opportunity to take part in creating a similar display of remembrance and pride.

Banners are professionally produced and designed to be displayed prominently in the community. In Rimbey, banners are displayed for a number of years before being returned to the sponsor or incorporated into a rotating display to ensure all veterans are honored over time, at the Museum.

This project not only honors individuals, but also strengthens community connection—bringing history to life and ensuring future generations remember the stories and sacrifices of those who served.

Bentley residents are invited to watch for more information in the coming weeks on purchasing a banner.

There will be limited banner availability in initial phases, with priority often given based on service history and order of application, so early participation will be encouraged.

This collective effort truly helps our town shine as we transition into the warmer months. Alongside the spring cleaning, your Town Council has been focused on infrastructure milestones, fiscal planning, and celebrating the local spirit that makes our community so special.

A Night to Remember: Arena Grand Re-Opening

The highlight of this spring was undoubtedly the Bentley Arena Grand Re-Opening on March 26th. After almost a year of extensive renovations—including a brand-new rink slab and significant facility upgrades—the doors are officially open! We would like to extend a sincere thank you to the previous Council members for their vision and hard work in getting this major project underway and navigating the complexities of such a large-scale renovation. Their dedication paved the way for this success.

One of the most moving moments of the evening was the presentation of the Tyler Haarstad Memorial Bursary. We would like to offer a special congratulations to *Scarlett Cole*, this year's deserving recipient. Seeing the community come together to honor Tyler's legacy while supporting our youth was a powerful reminder of the strength of our Bentley family.

We want to extend a heartfelt thank you to everyone who joined us for this celebration. From the families enjoying the public skate and cupcakes to the fans cheering on our youth players, the energy was incredible. It was an evening that reminded us all that the arena is more than just a building; it is the heart of our community.

Council News & Municipal Updates

Your Council has been active in the council chambers throughout March and April, addressing key items to keep Bentley moving forward:

- **Summer Infrastructure Work:** Looking ahead to the warmer months, residents should be aware of sewer replacement projects scheduled to take place this summer. These are essential upgrades to our town's utility infrastructure to ensure long-term reliability. Please stay tuned for specific locations and potential traffic impacts as we get closer to the start dates.
- **Strategic Partnerships:** The Town has entered into an agreement with Baytex Energy Corporation for the sale of treated effluent wastewater. This initiative helps reduce freshwater use while providing a sustainable alternative to our typical release into the Blindman River.
- **Sunset Heights Progress:** It is exciting to see the activity in Sunset Heights! The neighborhood is looking so great with all the new houses being built. With only one lot left, it is wonderful to see this part of our community nearing completion.
- **Community Input:** Thank you to everyone who completed the Municipal Development Plan (MDP) survey. Your feedback is essential as we shape the future direction of our town.

Community Programming & Engagement

There is plenty to do in Bentley this April! We encourage residents to take part in our local programming:

- **Seniors Wellness:** Join us for Movers & Groovers on Monday mornings (9:45 AM) or Chair Yoga on Wednesdays (10:30 AM) at the Town Office.
- **Kidz Club:** Our youth sessions have been a hit this month, featuring themes like Marble Run Engineering and our Earth Day Upcycle Challenge.
- **Stay & Play:** Our Friday morning sessions continue to offer a relaxed environment for young children and caregivers to connect and explore.

The snow has finally melted (for now), and things are starting to look very dry out there. A reminder that in Lacombe County, a burn permit is required for all controlled burns from March 1 to October 31 each year. Here are some key points to remember:

- Permits are free and can be obtained online 24/7 or in person at the County Office.
- Valid for up to seven days, permits are necessary for burning wood, charcoal briquettes, and other materials.
- Prohibited materials include plastic and rubber-coated items, and there are specific conditions for burning.
- Unauthorized burning can lead to significant fines and fire department response charges.
- For more information, you can visit the Lacombe County Fire Service website.

We have only had four calls over the past month, which were:

- On March 25, we were put on standby to assist Eckville Fire Departments with a motor vehicle accident. It turned out that our units were not needed, as they had the situation under control very quickly.
- On April 2, we responded to an alarms call at a residence here in town. It turned out to be a non-emergency smoke alarm due to cooking. Firefighters checked things out and returned to the hall.
- On April 12, a county resident's burn pit escaped its confines and began spreading in nearby tall grass. The homeowner was able to use a garden hose to knock down the fire on his own before we arrived, so we only had to douse some hot spots and give the perimeter a good soaking.
- Finally, on April 18 we responded to a reported structure fire at a business in town. This turned out to be a small fire in an electrical outlet box, which was contained to the wiring inside the box itself. After thoroughly checking with our Thermal Imaging Camera to ensure the fire had not spread, we wrapped up our hose and returned to the hall.

On March 23, we had a rare opportunity to burn an acquired structure. While this is something we don't do regularly, it is a valuable learning experience if used in the right way. Firefighters were able to see firsthand fire behaviours such as flashover, rollover, smoke characteristics (such as volume, velocity, density and colour), and collapse indicators. Moreover, they can experience these phenomena in a much less chaotic environment that we normally experience in an unplanned fire.

May and June mark the beginning of our busy season. Help us stay less busy by properly extinguishing your cigarettes, closely monitoring those burn pits and always driving defensively.

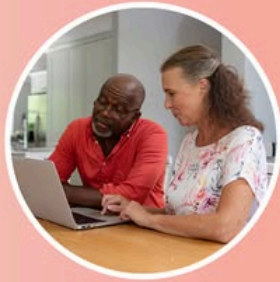

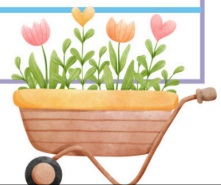
